#### Season of the Kvetch from Beata Abraham



We are a people who love to kvetch (complain), an inclination rooted in the long legacy of those who kvetched before us.

From our sacred texts: And Adam kvetched to Eve: "For sure, we can eat

anything. The weather is amazing. And the fruit is always in season. We do not needeth to wear clothes. But would it spoileth some divine plan if we ate an apple, for God's sake?" – Bereishit Rabbah, midrash on Genesis 1.

The people took to kvetching bitterly, saying "Oy" and "Vey iz mir." "Behold," said Moshe to God, "The Israelites really annoyeth me." – The Book of Numbers, ad nauseum. (Also, see pretty much the whole Torah.)

Ben Zoma said: Who is wise? One who learns from everyone. Who is mighty? One who

subdues one's passions. Who is rich? One who rejoices in one's portion. Who is honored? One who honors one's fellow human beings. Who is miserable? One who wins the lottery and kvetches that last week's pot was bigger. Others say, one who complains loudest that the bagels were gone by the time he (some say she) reaches the buffet at Kiddush lunch. (Other versions: the lox, not the bagels.) Some say, who is miserable? One who just moved one's car and forgot that alternate side parking hath been suspended (this view is observed only in New York City and walled cities) – Mishnah Avot, Ethics of the Patriarchy 1:4.

As we say farewell to the Tishrei holidays

(aka season of the kvetch: the temperature in the sanctuary, the length of the rabbi's sermon, the amount of food served at break the fast. the decorations in the Shul Sukkah...), let us intentionally embrace a new season of Kvelling. You have likely felt it: the feeling that you are bursting with pride over the accomplishments of someone you care for deeply. Kvelling feels so personal, so deep, that you simply need to share your exultation with the world, or risk exploding. The Yiddish translation of kvelling is: "Being filled with pride, to swell with delight over a family member's achievements, to be delighted by another's accomplishments, usually a relative. Once again, we can thank the Yiddish language for putting four sentences of meaning into one perfect, concise word.


Kvelling is best experienced in the moment, and kvelling after the fact can be a slippery slope veering into dreaded bragging territory. "Did I mention my grandson was accepted into

three different Ivy League schools?" Kvelling is more about the feeling of pride you have in the moment, rather than the

look of envy on someone's face as you regale them with your grandson's accomplishments.

There is the anticipatory kvell; waiting for the inevitable smacking of guests' lips in delicious rapture from the cholent your daughter made. The second-hand kvell; when as a guest, you feel emotional over the beautiful way the Bat Mitzvah delivers her Dvar Torah on the bima. The nostalgic kvell; looking at pictures and videos of your family and friends doing awesome things over the years. The tribal kvell; when Sandy Koufax answers to a higher calling and forgoes playing in the World Series because it is on Yom Kippur (versus the

tribal Shanda-embarrassment or shame, often experienced as the anticipatory tribal Shanda; the feeling when you are watching a crime story unfold on the news and fervently hoping that the perpetrator doesn't turn out to be Jewish. And let's not forget the poster boy for the tribal Shanda, Bernie Madoff.

Be careful to avoid the most obnoxious category of kvelling, the landmine that is the humble-kvell: A kvell masquerading as a kvetch. "There was so much traffic on the way to our beach house this weekend." You are fooling no one.

Most importantly, do not ignore the wise advice of *Bubbes* all over the world (who invariably have our backs) and warn that kvelling when things are too good will certainly invoke the *eyin hara* (evil eye), and cause all your reasons to kvell to disappear instantly (unless of course you distract the *eyin hara* by saying *kineahora*).

This Thanksgiving, put the transformative powers of the kvell to the test by actively seeking opportunities to point out and boldly share an achievement about each person sitting around your table. It doesn't have to be something monumental, just genuine. It must, however, be something about that person that makes your heart sing with joy simply thinking about it. Be ambitious and challenge others at the table to take a turn at kvelling. This experiment may alternate between easy and challenging (kvelling about 'Mean Grandma' might put you to the test), but it will transform the focus of your guests from "How do I survive this turkey coma?" to "I did not know that Uncle Sam built a lawnmower by himself by Googling a how-to video!" After all, isn't the point of Thanksgiving for everyone to stumble away from the table with bellies, hearts and souls filled to capacity?


