



Time To Listen *from Rabbi Alter*



The opening words of D'varim (Deuteronomy) are "*Eyleh ha-d'varim asher dibbehr Moshe* – These are the words that Moshe spoke..." While I'm no Moses, as a rabbi I identify with the centrality of words. Moshe's words

here aren't an ornament to his deeds. Rather, his words are the substance of his contribution. They are what Deuteronomy tells.

For many, it's important that I be the one to utter specific words of prayer and blessing during a service or ceremony. But beyond these "scripted" words, my task is often to find the right words for sermons, teachings, and presentations. To make them fresh, accurate, honest, worthy, and enlightening. To deliver them clearly and to lift up moments into the realm of the sacred through my words. In all these ways, the words I choose to speak are at the heart of my rabbinate.

With this month's column I want to highlight another function central to my role: listening. Of course, I need to listen to the voice of the Torah, hearing not only what it seems to say on its surface but also to be attuned to its quieter teachings. Our sacred sources are only part of the story. I need to hear your voices, too. I'm hardly worthy of the title Rabbi if I only talk to, or worse – talk at, the community without also, or even primarily, listening.

Pulling me aside during a kiddush lunch can be tough, as I may be able to give ear for a moment, but often not long enough. However, I learn so much when congregants come and visit

with me in my office, or give me a call. We are also blessed here in Milwaukee with coffee shops aplenty and abundant walking paths. All are good places to talk. And for me to listen.

When you share with me what you're really thinking and feeling, I hope it will be an unburdening for you. Maybe you'll express your satisfaction, discovery, joy, or relief. Maybe you'll give voice to your disappointment, confusion, alienation, or sorrow. Perhaps to your anger. Your words may be easy or hard for me to hear. No matter. They're your words, and they matter to me. We might agree, or we might remain far apart on a given matter. But our commitment to one another is that we find a way to be in community together, to draw on tradition together, and to channel our commitments into sacred service. I don't have expectations for the form or content of the words you might share. I'll make every effort to listen without judgment.

While I make no promises about the outcome of our conversations, I am committed to the process of inviting and listening to you.

Clicking on the link will show you most of the available time slots on my calendar for several weeks ahead. Choose one and we're good to go. If you don't see a good match, email or call me and we'll figure out a time.

On Sukkot we read from Kohelet (Ecclesiastes). Its most famous passage, the one that gives rise to the classic folk song, *Turn, Turn, Turn*, opens chapter 3. There we read that there is a time to hold silent and a time to speak. True it is for all of us. Remember that for me, too, there is a time to stay silent long enough so you may speak, and I may listen.

The Step by Step Guide to Talking to Your Child About God

The long anticipated (and sometimes dreaded) moment has arrived – your child has come to you with questions about your belief in and/or relationship with God.

If you are anxious about answering – perhaps even paralyzed with the fear of saying

the wrong thing, and sending your child spiraling down a lifelong abyss of confusing, anchorless spirituality – fear not. Yes, it's a BIG TOPIC, but here are some ways to get through this trepidatious occasion.

Step one: Congratulate yourself! You are officially the parent of a child who has recognized and begun to grapple with the universal questions of life. More important: *Your prodigy is actually interested in your beliefs.* Mazel tov! Act like this is perfectly normal, and the two of you regularly mull over the meaning of life together.

Step two: Take a deep breath, and express your opinions and beliefs freely. Regardless of whether your religious beliefs are firm –

grounded in the logic of science or steeped in the amorphous nature of spirituality – let it all hang out. Every human being is entitled to their beliefs, and expressing them to your child is not to be confused with indoctrination. It

is simply modeling the concept that you are a person who has given these questions the hefty thought that they deserve. This is a good thing, and important for your child to know. Completely disregard any and all eye rolling (alas, this moment is not about you).

Step three: Keep in mind that you do not have to give the “right” answer. Remind yourself that if all of your words had a lifelong impact on your child, their room would remain spotless *at all times*, and they would be showering you

with the gratitude you deeply deserve. Instead, this conversation about God will be much like all of your others: You will express your deepest, most heartfelt thoughts and platitudes, and your child will add this information to the ginormous bucket in which they are collecting drops of knowledge and opinions before arriving at their own conclusions. The same conclusions that they will arrive at, with or without your input. However, what does matter, is that you model the importance of taking the time to contemplate these significant matters.

Step four: Understand that your child is struggling with the exact same things with which you struggle. Your kid is wondering: Why is there injustice in this world? Why do bad things happen to good people? How can I make a difference? What is my purpose on this earth? If these questions sound familiar, it is likely due to your own continued search for the answers. You both have this in common.

Step five: This brings us to the shared journey for answers. Just let your child know that you are both on this path – along with pretty much all of humanity. There is comfort and inspiration in companionship, even when

provided by the least cool parent in the world (and yes, sorry to say, I'm talking to you). Once you have pointed out that you share the journey, just listen. A lot. When the opportunity arises, ask many open-ended questions designed to elicit a full, meaningful answer, then listen some more. Your child

is trying on their opinions for size by expressing them aloud. They are far from being fully formed.

Final step: Begin the kvelling – you have earned it! Though you may be deeply uncool (see: Step five), take pride knowing you are raising a thoughtful, inquisitive future adult who also cares what you think. You must be doing something very right, so sit back and wait for the compliments about raising an amazing kid to roll in. You have nailed parenting once again!

Whether by paper form or online, all authorizations must be in hand in the CBINT office by **9:30 AM on Wednesday, APRIL 5, 2023 (no exceptions)**.

In coordination with the sale, we are collecting contributions for MAOT HITTIM, funds for institutions supporting those in need. Beneficiaries may include, e.g., MAZON: A Jewish Response to Hunger, The Jewish Community Food Pantry, and Jewish Family Services.

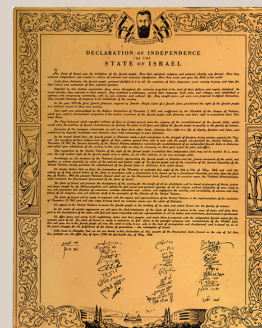
