



Insights from CBINT's Virtual Visit with Rakefet Ginsberg, CEO Masorti Israel *from Steve Russek*



Many of us in the Milwaukee Jewish community remember Rakefet Ginsberg as the *shlichah* from the Jewish Agency for Israel to the Milwaukee Jewish community from 2006-2009. Before coming to the U.S., Rakefet was a social worker

and community worker. Although her family was a member of a Reform synagogue, Jewish and Israeli communal involvement was a small part of their life.

Like many Israelis, the Ginsbergs saw but two choices: live their lives as secular Israelis or Orthodox Israelis. They realized, on their return to Israel, that their *shlichut* experience gave them a new perspective through which to view their life. Their choice was not binary. Rather, they recognized the "wealth of Judaism that exists around us," and that they could choose to live a meaningful Jewish life between the two extremes. Their journey led to their involvement with a Masorti Movement *kehillah*. For those of you unfamiliar with the Israeli Masorti Movement, it is an allied movement of American Conservative Judaism.

Rakefet's nascent engagement with the Israeli Masorti Movement led her to become its CEO and executive director in 2020.

On Sunday, March 12, CBINT held a virtual event with Rakefet to educate our members about the work of the Israeli Masorti Movement. It turns out that the work of the Masorti Movement goes well beyond serving Israelis interested in Conservative Judaism.

The Israeli Masorti Movement serves Israeli Jews through 90 *kehillot* (congregations) around Israel. These 90 *kehillot* reside in 62 of Israel's 257

municipalities.

It provides *Sifrei Torah*, tefillin, talitot, Chumashim and Siddurim, and rabbinical or lay leadership to enable Israeli Jews and Jews from around the world to pray and celebrate holidays and bar/bat mitzvah ceremonies at the Egalitarian Kotel (Ezrat Israel <https://en.ezratisrael.com> – this link includes a means to reserve time and resources for the Egalitarian Kotel). During the "high season," overlapping with the summer tourist season, there are over 40 bar and bat mitzvah ceremonies per day! Masorti Israel does not provide these services solely for Masorti-affiliated Jews. Rather, it serves all Israeli Jews and Jews from around the world (secular, Reform, Masorti, and even liberal Orthodox Jews who prefer not to worship in the haredi administered section of the Kotel). Simply, pluralistic Judaism at its best.

Masorti Israel's NOAM youth movement includes participants from Masorti, secular, and liberal Orthodox families. Together, the children study and experience what it means to live pluralistic *halakhic* Judaism.

Masorti Israel's Bar/ Bat Mitzvah for Children with Special Needs Program is unique in Israel. Each year the program prepares hundreds of children with special needs for their bar or bat mitzvah celebration. Classes taught by Masorti teachers include the use of their pioneering accessible Siddur and other alternative communication methods.

During our virtual discussion with Rakefet, we learned about Masorti Israel's work to preserve liberal democratic values in Israel in the face of the current Israeli coalition government effort to restructure the relationship between the Israeli Judiciary and the Knesset. We've reached the season when Shabbat ends rather late. This week, Shabbat will end at 8 p.m. and keep advancing until July 1, when it will end at 9:17 p.m. Given the present lateness of the hour for Ma'ariv and Havdalah on Saturday evenings, **we are suspending our standing Zoom Ma'ariv and Havdalah on Saturday evenings until October 14, 2023**, when Shabbat's end will have retreated back to 6:53 p.m. **Please note that congregants who need a Saturday evening service may advise Rabbi Alter or Hazzan Stein, who will gladly help recruit Zoom attendees.**

Two important notes: It is right and proper to pray the Ma'ariv service and Havdalah (easy!) at home on one's own. Hazzan Stein and Rabbi Alter will happily guide anyone who wants to learn them, and siddurim are available to borrow or purchase from CBINT.

All other CBINT services continue on schedule through the spring and summer, both Room and Zoom: Sun-Fri: 6 p.m.; Mon-Fri: 7:30 a.m.; Sunday (and some national holidays): 9 a.m.; Shabbat: 9:30 a.m.

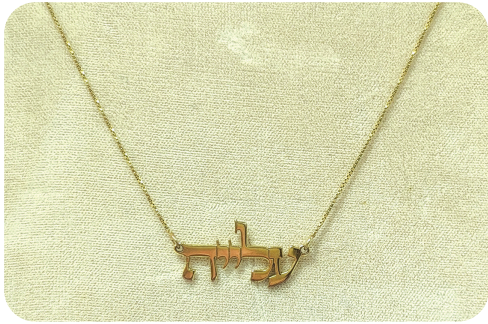

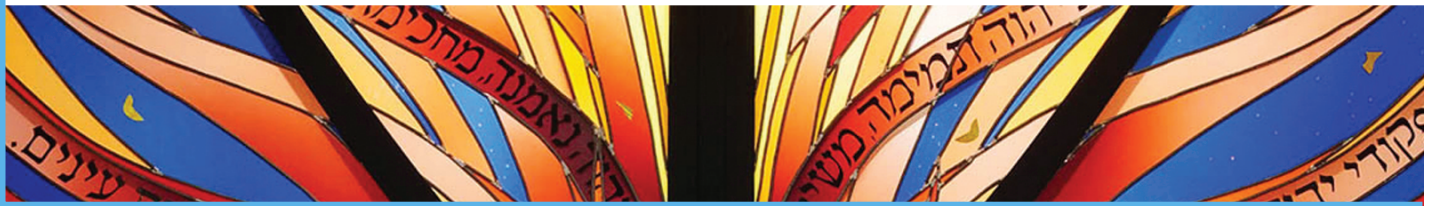

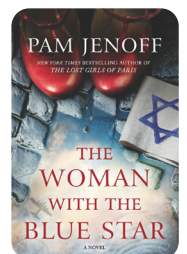
